Title: "Tree trimming? Your actions may impact wildlife?"



Why are tree care practices important to the survival of wildlife? Because the way tree care is performed can greatly impact legally protected nesting birds and other tree dwelling wildlife.

- Pruning can remove habitat critical to wildlife survival and nest sites.
- Canopy thinning may expose birds and their nests to harsh weather and predators.
- Removing dead and dying trees and branches can diminish habitat for cavity nesting birds and animals.
- Noise associated with equipment and worker presence can cause early fledging and nest abandonment. You can ask your tree care provider to adopt these practices when managing your trees.



Trees provide many benefits to urban communities, including shade, energy savings, increased property values, walkable streets, and wildlife habitat.
